American artist Loren Eiferman transforms wood into intricate sculptures that explore the interplay between nature and human experience. Her fascination with organic forms and textures allows her to create works that evoke a sense of wonder and connectivity. Eiferman earned her BA in Art History at New York University, followed by an MFA in Sculpture from the School of Visual Arts in New York City. Her sculptures are featured in private collections across the United States and have been exhibited in prestigious galleries and museums, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the SculptureCenter, and the DeCordova Sculpture Park and Museum.

Kelcie Mack

My artwork honors craftsmanship. I explore the secret lives of unconsidered objects.

Kelcie Mack presents abstract paintings that focus on the intimate, familiar connections we hold with objects and their makers. She explores interactions between negative space and the object, manipulating space and dissecting the furniture into its key components. Through her work, Mack calls attention to the value of craftsmanship and the histories that exist within all objects. The paintings are personal as she considers her tender relationship with the subject and attempts to honor the ordinary by transforming recognizable elements of furniture into semi abstract compositions that highlight the complex beauty of design.

Mile Saula

In my artistic exploration, I seek to unravel the profound relationship between the forest as a physical and symbolic space and its role in the human subconscious. Through textured layers and muted palettes, I aim to capture the duality of the woods—a place of both chaos and refuge, mystery and meditation—inviting viewers to explore its depth and resonance. — Mile Saula

Mile Saula's work is a poetic meditation on the timeless allure of the forest. Rooted in the interplay between abstraction and representation, his creations explore the emotional and spiritual dimensions of wooded landscapes. Drawing inspiration from folklore, dreams, and personal experiences, Mile's works feature organic forms, shadowy hues, and intricate textures that evoke the untamed beauty of nature. Through mediums such as painting, drawing, and mixed media, Mile crafts compositions that bridge the external and internal, embodying the forest as both a mirror of human complexity and a site of transformative possibility. His work invites viewers to step into the unknown, embracing the chaos and magic of the woods while finding solace in their inherent tranquility.

Sabine Kühner

Art is more than expression — it is a process of healing and self-discovery. — Sabine Kühner

Sabine Kühner's paintings unfold through intuitive gesture and luminous color, where abstracted figures and dreamlike forms emerge from layered compositions. Blending the figurative and the abstract, her work explores themes of memory, transformation, and emotional resonance. Using oil, acrylic, graphite, and watercolor, Kühner builds each piece from spontaneous color fields, allowing silhouettes and faces to surface and recede like passing thoughts. Influenced by her studies with Markus Lüpertz and her background in yoga and therapeutic practice, her work carries a meditative, healing quality. Rooted in movement and introspection, Kühner's art invites viewers into a quiet, poetic space where body, landscape, and emotion merge into one.

Rob Ventura

In my artistic exploration, I delve into the intricate relationship between botanical imagery and the animistic essence of nature. Through nuanced brushwork and vibrant colors, I aim to capture the serene harmony that permeates the natural world, inviting viewers to contemplate its beauty and significance. — Rob Ventura

Rob Ventura's diverse creations meld organic, emotive shapes with the principles of the golden ratio. His evocative imagery draws from a rich tapestry of natural elements including flowers, fauna, microbes, cells, animal prints, fungi, butterflies, insects, honeycombs, and more.
